Understanding the Ethnic Ancestry in Your DNA Test

Many DNA tests now include a breakdown of your overall ethnic ancestry. Yet many people don't get the results they expect. Different companies may show different results for the same person. People also wonder why siblings see different results in the same test, or why Native American ancestry does not always show up as expected. We will review and compare actual ethnicity reports from AncestryDNA, 23andMe, FTDNA's Family Finder, MyHeritage, LivingDNA, GEDmatch, National Geographic's Geno 2.0 and Insitome.
